Code of Behaviour



All members of the School community are expected to:

1) Respect others

- Always show mutual consideration and respect to others
- Create a safe environment that is inclusive
- Build trust between you and the School community
- Respect all others' race; religion; gender; sexual orientation; disability; age; social background

2) Support learning

- Take responsibility, alongside your teachers for your own learning progress
- Be curious and open minded
- Work collaboratively accepting that others may not necessarily share your point of view
- Reflect on your experiences

3) Enhance the School's reputation

- Be a kind, understanding and respectful individual, as a School ambassador and responsible citizen
- Behave professionally while representing the School
- Be a credit to the school through your commitment to performance, work ethic with guest teachers and presence on social media platforms

4) Take care of yourself

- Take your wellbeing seriously and seek support when you need it
- Recognise that it is a natural for new ideas to be confusing or sometimes overwhelming
- Work mindfully in relation to safe dance practice and healthily meeting your personal needs
- Recognise your strengths and work constructively and patiently with areas for improvement

5) Take care of our facilities

- Take pride in the school facilities
- Respect the property and resources of the School and other people
- Comply with any safety requirements of the course, the School environment and related activities
- Consider the environmental impacts of your actions
